\* Priority groups for the H1N1 flu vaccine have been identified at a federal level. We are committed to making it available over time to everyone. Those individuals who need it the most include (in no particular order):

- People under 65 with chronic medical conditions;
- Pregnant women greater than 20 weeks or pregnant women at any stage with other medical conditions;
- Children 6 months up to 5 years of age;
- Health care workers involved in pandemic response or the delivery of essential health care services;
- First responders;
- Poultry and swine workers; and,
- Household contacts and care providers of persons at high risk who cannot be immunized or may not respond to vaccines such as infants less than six months of age and persons who are immunocompromised.
