Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Announces Nominees

This month, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame released its list of nominees for 2017. This year, Pearl Jam, Journey, Tupac Shakur, and several other newcomers join previous nominees Chaka Khan, Chic, The Cars, Joe Tex, Craftwerk, MC5, The Zombies, J. Gelis Band, Yes, and Janet Jackson. An artist or a group can only be nominated 25 years after the release of their first album. However, just because an artist is eligible, it doesn't guarantee a direct nomination. While artists such as Michael Jackson and Madonna have been nominated and inducted within their first eligible year, others such as Chaka Khan and Janet Jackson haven't been so lucky. Khan has been eligible since 2003, but has only been nominated two other times, and Jackson has been eligible since 2007, but has only been nominated one other time. Other musicians such as Whitney Houston and Mariah Carey have yet to be nominated. A lot of fans are hoping for Janet Jackson to be inducted after the movement titled #InductJanet was started over the summer. The five inductees will be announced in December, with the ceremony taking place sometime in the spring.

Whether that is intentional or just human nature, it happens. It has now been a year since Justin Trudeau was elected Prime Minister in October 2015. Now it's time to take a look at the good and the bad of what he's done in his first year in office. WHAT'S GOOD?

- Immediately upon taking office Trudeau fulfilled one of his campaign promises and created the first gender-equal government cabinet in Canadian history.
- Trudeau's government has lowered the retirement age from 67 back to 65, which was what it had been before it was raised by Stephen Harper in 2012.
- Trudeau has created the Prime Minister's Youth Council to allow young Canadians to have their voices heard by the government.
- After Trudeau took office, Canada has signed the Paris Climate Agreement to help combat global climate change. This is a huge change from back in 2013 when Canada was ranked as having the worst environmental protection rules in the developed world.
- Nice hair.

ON THE OTHER HAND...

- During the election, Trudeau promised to end the Conservative government's policy of taking away citizenship from foreign-born Canadians who committed serious crimes such as terrorism, saying "a Canadian is a Canadian is a Canadian." However, over the past year Trudeau's government has instead increased how often the law is used and has stripped more Canadians of their citizenship than every other government in the past 27 years combined.
- Trudeau pledged to change the way Canada's elections work. He thought the current system was unfair and did not properly represent the country... until the current system allowed him to win an election majority with only 39% of the popular vote. He has now changed his mind and feels the way things are is fine after all.
- The government has so far gone nearly \$30 billion deeper into debt this year.

Women in Politics:

Although women make up about 50% of the world population, they are almost always outnumbered by men in prominent positions within the workforce. The lack of females in politics highlights this, with only 26% of the seats in the Canadian House of Parliament held by women, and much less than that in many other countries. 
