

# SWC SKI CLUB 2026 SEASON

The SWC ski club includes lift tickets, lessons, and transportation. With heavily discounted rates. Safety, sportsmanship and proper conduct are stressed, as well as having a good time.

#### 2026 PROGRAM SCHEDULE

Students will travel to Blue Mountain Resort, near Collingwood, Ontario by luxury coach bus, leaving for three (3) full-day ski/snowboard trips. Leaving at 6:30 am and returning to Sir Winston Churchill at 9 pm each day.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE DATES FOR OUR TRIPS ARE SET, THEY ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE DUE TO UNFORSEEN CIRCUMSTANCES.

#### **PROGRAM COST**

The three(3) separate day program, including lessons costs \$250.00

Payment will be through School Cash Online, found on sirwinston.dsbn.org.

Please Note: Funds/forms are due by Monday, November 24, 2025.

You "Must" pay for all 3 trips, or you do not qualify. You can't pick and choose dates; it is all or nothing regarding Registration. If you choose not to go on one, there is no refund unless a doctor's note is included due to an injury.

#### LESSONS/LEVEL OF ABILITY EVALUATION

Lessons/Assessment are included in this program and are intended to progressively develop and perfect the skills of all levels of skiers/snowboarders. They are an **essential part** of this program and are a mandatory component of participating.

All skiers/snowboarders must have an Assessment at the start of each day regardless of ability level.

#### **HELMETS**

In adherence with the District School Board of Niagara policy, students "participating in out of school programs, involving skiing or snowboarding, must wear a helmet designed specifically for skiing or snowboarding." Students not in possession of a proper helmet will not be allowed on the bus.

Students found skiing/boarding without a helmet will forfeit the remainder of the season without a refund.

INHERENT RISK FORMS TO BE SIGNED AND COMPLETED - 7 items to be Completed or Signed - See P.6

Skiing/Snowboarding/Snowblading is a sport with physical demands and inherent risks which are beyond the control of Blue Mountain Resort, and the District School Board of Niagara. Falls, collisions and other incidents may occur which can result in serious injury or death. Participants *must assume* the inherent risks of the sport. *Following all rules and procedures can reduce the risk of injury.* Failure to follow the rules will result in the student losing their lift ticket and future resort privileges.

1. Parents and participants must complete Appendix #1: Note To Parents and Students indemnifying the DSBN, chaperones, and Blue Mountain Resort from injuries sustained while on SWC ski club trips.

#### 2. & 3. ALPINE SKIERS' RESPONSIBILITY CODE - Appendix 1b and 1c - Need to be signed

The Ontario School Boards' Insurance Exchange (OSBIE) have produced a Snow Resort Safety Guide (see OSBIE Ski Package at www.osbie.on.ca) which Blue Mountain Resort, and the District School Board of Niagara require you to know and obey.

Blue Mountain Resort may revoke a ski ticket for violation of the code or other unacceptable conduct.

- 5. Complete/sign: "Field Trip Consent Form"
- 6. Complete/sign: "Snowsport Notice To Parents and Students"
- 7. Look at Appendix #2 "Your Winter 2025/2026 School Trip Permission Forms" and logon to the link under the heading "PERMISSION FORMS". Parents and Student Participants "MUST" complete the online registration forms for Blue Mountain Resort or You do not have a seat on the Bus.

Once you have <u>fully registered and paid the full amount</u> (\$250.00) you have secured a seat on a bus.

The SWC Ski Club's Wednesday Day trips can only be used on an official Sir Winston Secondary School Ski Trip. It is not transferable and will not be given to students unless on a sanctioned Ski Trip. This is the contractual arrangement between Blue Mountain Ski Resort and Sir Winston Churchill Secondary School. Students cannot drive themselves; these are School Board sanctioned trips and participation requires Teacher supervision.

#### **EMERGENCIES**

In case of injury, Ski Patrollers are on duty at the Blue Mountain site. Our school advisor, Mr. Witterick, will attempt to contact parents in cases requiring hospitalization, removal by ambulance (possibly air ambulance) or for a situation where the skier may be more comfortable if picked up by parents from Blue Mountain or in a situation where a student may need medical care. We will make sure your skier is taken care of and comforted. Our school advisor carries a cell phone to stay in touch and respond to emergencies or other skier needs.

If a parent needs to contact a skier or chaperone while we are skiing, call the Main Office at SWC at 905-684-6349 and tell them you either need to leave a message or have a chaperone call you. They will return your call as soon as they can.

#### **ONLINE Information**

Your registration will be done with paper copies, and the payment is done online. For general information, please find the Ski Club link on the Sir Winston website, outlined below.

#### **INSURANCE** - Health Card

All students must have proof of insurance and are required to bring their Health Card with them on each Ski Trip.

#### **REFUNDS**

You can get a full refund, if either day is cancelled due to unforeseen (weather?) circumstances. There is no refund if you miss the bus due to lateness.

No refunds will be given to any student removed from the club for disciplinary reasons.

#### COMPLETING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

Seats are sold on a first come first serve basis. If we have enough skiers to **entirely** fill an additional bus, we will have room to register up to 50 more skiers. An announcement will be made if there is still room on the busses, with details about sign up location and time.

#### **UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR**

In accordance with the DSBN and the Safe Schools Policy, the use of drugs or tobacco products, and the consumption of alcoholic beverage is forbidden. Students breaking this rule will not be allowed to return on the ski bus. Parents will be contacted and requested to retrieve their son or daughter. No refund will be given to students who are suspended from the program. Substance violations could lead to criminal charges in addition to School and DSBN consequences.

#### **DEPARTURE from SWC**

Students will be expected at the School Parking Lot at 6:00am to board the buses. They are to bring their equipment and proceed to the bus immediately. We cannot wait for late skiers who have forgotten items such as a Health Card or equipment.

Buses are leaving at 6:30am - it is a 3-hour journey, and we are leaving on time.

All skiers are expected to ride to Blue Mountain on the bus. Those wishing to make their own way to are not considered to be part of the SWC Ski Club that day and a pass will not be provided to the skier in that case.

#### **RETURN INFORMATION**

Our return trip leaves Blue Mountain at 6:00 PM. Riders must be at the bus no later than 5:45 PM to check in and load gear. If a rider fails to board the bus for the return trip by 6:00 PM, they will not be allowed to ski the following week. If this occurs because of rider negligence more than once, the rider will be removed from the club without refund.

#### PICK UP INFORMATION FOR PARENTS:

We will return to SWC by 9:00PM under normal circumstances. Parents are expected to be at SWC before 9:00 PM to pick up their child. Chaperones cannot leave until all skiers have been picked up. We cannot control or predict weather or traffic conditions that might delay our arrival in St. Catharines. In the event of a major delay, we will attempt to contact someone who will come to SWC and inform waiting parents. Unless otherwise notified by their child while we are in transit home, <u>parents are to assume we are on time</u>. Parents late for pick up should be aware that their child will be placed on probation and lose the privilege of being a member of ski club if the situations recur.

#### **EQUIPMENT**

Skis and poles/snowboards should be enclosed in an appropriate bag to facilitate loading and unloading as well as to protect ski and board cosmetics. Please label your equipment—skis, boots, clothing, boards and place a luggage tag on boot and ski bags.

#### **EQUIPMENT RENTAL**

The most economical option is to rent for the entire season. Ski Pro Shop at 278 Geneva St. in St. Catharines rents ski and snowboard equipment. Phone: 905-934-2682. There is also a Niagara Falls Ski Rental Shop that rents equipment for the season at a very good price. See Mr. Witterick if you would like to rent from them.

#### **LOST EQUIPMENT:**

Parents must accept responsibility for equipment that is lost or damaged. It is recommended to purchase and use a lock on all unattended ski/boarding equipment while at Blue Mountain. SWC is not responsible for unattended items stolen from the lodge. It is best that students leave valuable items especially iPods, cell phones on the bus.

Thank you for reading and following these guidelines.

#### WHAT TIME DO WE Leave?

The buses will be here by 6:10am. All participants should be on their "Assigned Bus" by 6:30, and buses are leaving at 6:30am from the Sir Winston Churchill School Parking Lot.

#### WHAT TIME DO WE GET HOME?

We plan to get home by 9pm. You should call your parents to confirm our arrival time when we reach Grimsby area on the ride home.

#### WHAT TIME DO WE LEAVE Blue Mountain?

We leave by 6:00 p.m. All skiers must be on the bus by 5:45pm – no exceptions. If you are late returning to the bus, you won't join us the following week.

## I DON'T OWN EQUIPMENT BUT I'D LIKE TO LEARN TO SKI OR BOARD; CAN I RENT EQUIPMENT TO CHECK IT OUT BEFORE COMMITTING TO BUYING?

We strongly suggest that beginner boarders or skiers rent equipment before buying. Renting is often more economical from Ski Pro Shop on Geneva St. or see Mr. Witterick for info on a Niagara Falls Ski Shop that also rents equipment at a good price. To be clear: chaperones are not in charge of arranging this or supervising an individual's rental needs.

#### CAN I SIT WITH MY FRIENDS ON THE BUS?

Of course, you can sit with your friends. It is a first-come, first-serve bus seating arrangement during the Registration Process. Register with your friend at the same time and you will ensure your seating

#### DO I NEED MONEY?

Only if you choose to eat at the ski resort. The Sir Winston Churchill Ski Club does not provide food. That is the student participant's responsibility, not the Ski Club.

#### CAN I EAT ON THE BUS?

You can eat on the bus, just clean up afterwards. If your bus chaperone finds garbage left behind at the end of the night, your bus could lose this privilege.

#### I WANT TO DRIVE TO Blue Mountain WITH SOME FRIENDS. CAN I HAVE MY PASS PLEASE?

All ski club members must travel to and from Blue Mountain on the bus provided. Ski club members are not to travel to Blue Mountain on ski club days on their own. Our insurance only covers students who travel to and from Blue Mountain with us, and this is like a School Board Field Trip. No exceptions will be made.

Skill Classifications (for skiing/ boarding/ blading).

Non-skier: Non skiers have never skied/boarded/bladed before. All non-skiers/boarders/bladers MUST take a lesson on the first day prior to using the lift/slopes and every session thereafter.

Beginner: Beginners have skied/boarded/bladed once or twice or a few times per year and has experienced and maintained control on a number of novice hills of varying difficulty. He/She is able to stop and turn with some success. Beginners should only ski on trails labelled with a green dot.

Intermediate: The student has skied/boarded/bladed on many occasions and has experienced a variety of hills and different ski areas. He/she can turn and stop under control using recognized formal techniques. Intermediates should only use green or blue trails.

Advanced: Advanced skiers ski controlled parallel turns and can ski very well on blue trails. They can control their speed and rhythm on black diamond trails and can adjust the size and length of their turns.

Expert: Expert skiers ski with good technique on all terrain and snow conditions. They can easily ski moguls and are able to ski black diamond trails with confidence using carved turns.

to ski/snowboard/tube. This signed form is required for all students who wish to participate in this outdoor recreation and snowsport education program. It should be understood that the purpose of this excursion is educational. Lessons are mandatory for skiing and snowboarding.
INHERENT RISK
Skiing Snowboarding is a sport with physical demands and inherent risks which are beyond the (Skiing/Snowboarding/Tubing)
control of Blue Mountain Resort, and the District School Board of Niagara. Falls, collisions
(Name of Resort) and other incidents may occur which result in serious injury or death. Participants <i>must assume</i> the inherent risks of the sport.
Following all rules and procedures can reduce the risk of injury. Failure to follow the rules will result in the student losing their lift ticket and future resort privileges.
EQUIPMENT
Blue Mountain provides rental equipment. Bindings on equipment reduce the risk (Name of Resort)
of injury when falling. They will not release under all circumstances and they do not guarantee safety in all cases. Parents must accept responsibility for equipment that is lost or damaged (other than reasonable wear and tear).
All participants must wear an appropriate snowsport helmet for school excursions. The District Schoo Board of Niagara adopts a mandatory snowsport helmet policy regardless of ski facility locations.
ALPINE RESPONSIBILITY CODE
The Ontario Snow Resorts Association has produced a Responsibility Code which Blue Mountain Resort
and the District School Board of Niagara requires that you know and obey. Skiers/Snowboarders/ Tubers must always be in control and be able to stop and change direction to avoid collisions with people or objects.
Blue Mountain Resert may revoke a ski ticket for violation of the code or other unacceptable conduct
