National Truth & Reconciliation Day Sept. 30

On Monday, Sept. 30, SWC will be commemorating the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (formerly Orange Shirt Day) through Indigenous films. Students will watch short, subject-specific films in each of their four classes. These, and the class discussions which follow, will provide them with the opportunity to learn of the impacts of Canadian policies such as residential schools, but also of the resiliency, strength, and contributions of Indigenous people today. While this day may be emotionally difficult, it is an important one for students to participate in as Canadians travel the path of reconciliation. Our social worker, Sarah Lichter, will be available for students who may need extra support. All members of the SWC community are also encouraged to wear orange on Sept. 30.

School Safety Week

Next week is School Safety Week at SWC. In their Period 1 classes at the start of the week, students will go through a slide deck with their teachers about Fire drills, Lockdowns, Hold and Secure, and Shelter in Place. Near the end of the week all teachers in all periods will talk with their students about exits from their classroom and meeting spots outside in the event of a fire or fire drill. They will also speak with their students about what a Lockdown would look like in their particular learning space. The purpose of School Safety Week is to help all students feel comfortable in our building and knowledgeable about safety procedures at SWC.

COBS BREAD Cross Country Running Fundraiser 2024: Sept 10-Sept 25

The SWC Cross Country Running team has teamed up with Cobs Bread, on Fourth Ave in Ridley Square, to participate in this incredible fundraiser.

We are offering a free loaf of bread a month for 12 months. Each card costs \$25 which calculates to just over \$2 per loaf. The value of the card depends on what Loaf that is chosen, but to give you a sense of the value, their white and whole wheat loaves cost \$4.60 and their most expensive loaf costs \$8.75 so whoever purchases, the card could see savings of anywhere from \$30 to \$80 over the year!

There is no limit to how many cards you can purchase, just know that you will only be able to redeem one card per day. So, if you purchase 4 cards, you can redeem one each week of the month (for example).

You can purchase it for yourself, family or friends. We have a limited number of cards to sell so hurry and get one before they are all gone.

Please consider purchasing a card or two or more to help the Cross-Country Running Team. Raised funds will help offset costs for trips and registration fees for this season's running meets.
